


From the Desk of John Shipper Past Shooters President



January 2019

Greetings to all Past Shooters,

Thank you to past Presidents Don Kennedy and Dick Gray for choosing to select me as President of the One Shot Past Shooters. It is an honor.

Also, a big thank you to our Past Shooters staff: Executive Vice President Scott Harnsberger, Executive Director Vickie Hutchinson-Renkert, Office Manager Gina Colovich, Past President of the One Shot Hunt Club Paul Fontaine and our Past Shooters Board. I look forward to working with the new One Shot President Wade Alexander and his Board.

The renovation and expansion of the One Shot Past Shooters offices and the Water for Wildlife Museum is the major accomplishment of 2018. Many thanks to Frank Bandy (1971 One Shot International Team), the Bandy family, the Museum Committee and Paul Fontaine, General Contractor.

Attendance at the 2018 Foo Foo Rah, September One Shot Hunt and for returning 2017 Past Shooters was down significantly. We plan to address the issue of decreased attendance at the 2019 Foo Foo Rah Business Meeting.

On a delightfully positive note, the number of wives and guests accompanying Past Shooters in 2018 was a 30% increase over 2017. The Ladies' Silent Auction raised an all-time high of over \$4,000. The live auction raised \$40,000 for Water Projects.

The 2019 Foo Foo Rah

For the convenience of the members, the Past Shooters will hold the 2019 Foo Foo Rah at Woolley's Classic Suites adjacent to the Denver International Airport (DIA). (Woolley's provides complimentary shuttle service to and from DIA and within a five-mile radius of the hotel.) This change of venue will eliminate excessive travel time for members who must fly into DIA and then drive 6 hours to Lander.

We encourage all Past Shooters to actively support the One Shot Hunt and the Foo Foo Rah. Keep in mind that we conduct most of the One Shot Past Shooters business at the Foo-Foo Rah. We will hold the Foo Foo Rah business meetings Friday morning May 31, 2019 in the Monaco Room at Woolley's Classic Suites.

In addition to the Foo Foo Rah Friday morning business meetings, the Past Shooters Executive Director Vickie Hutchinson-Renkert is enthusiastically planning and scheduling a variety of activities. From Woolley's Classic Suites Past Shooters and their guests will have access to first-class restaurants, the nearby Gaylord Rockies Resort, shopping and light-rail to the Denver City Center.

The Foo Foo Rah's Saturday Shooting Activities and lunch will be held at the Colorado Clays, which is Colorado's Premier Public Shooting Facility. Note that Colorado Clays will be open from 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. on Thursday and Friday. Members wanting to practice in hopes of Saturday "bragging rights" can make arrangements to shoot on those days.

The Colorado Clays Shooting Park features 8 trap ranges, 2 skeet fields, 2 wobble traps, a 15-station sporting clays course, a 100-yard rifle range, a 25-yard pistol range and a very comfortable Club House.

We encourage all Past Shooters to attend the 2019 business meetings on Friday morning May 31st. Remember that the Foo Foo Rah is not all business. It is also fun, good times and tall tales. The Past Shooters staff is working diligently to make sure that the Foo Foo Rah meetings and activities are enjoyable for both members and their spouses and guests. The Foo Foo Rah is also the perfect opportunity to get to know other Past Shooters.

Thank you for the opportunity to serve as the One Shot Past Shooters President.







Official License Issuance Rules



To receive a license and be placed on Priority List Two you <u>MUST</u> apply for a Wyoming Antelope License through the Wyoming Game and Fish. If you are successful in your draw, congratulations! If you are unsuccessful you <u>MUST</u> send a complete screen shot of your unsuccessful draw that has your NAME and UNSUCCESSFUL on it to <u>antelope@oneshotpastshooters.com</u>. Time is of the essence as your standing on the Priority List Two is ranked by the email inbox. The list is generated by when your email arrives to this inbox. To be placed on the Priority List Two, you <u>MUST email</u> your screen shot to the above address. No walk ins, no mail, no fax, and absolutely NO phone calls. A "received" confirmation email will be sent to you. You are responsible for ensuring that you know when the draw results will be announced. Your Unsuccessful Draw results can be sent to the email address by anyone. Please do not send draw results for your guests. The final list will be vetted by the License Draw Chairman and his decision on all licenses and placements is final.

One Shot Hunt Past Shooters License Issuance

- 1) Last year's Team Members will be on List One. You need to apply for a License through the WY Game & Fish. List One will list members who apply and send in rejections first. Returning new Past Shooters from last year who are registered will then be listed in order of registration. (All returning members from last year's hunt will receive a tag).
- 2) Past Shooters who have furnished proof (screen shot from WY Game & Fish) which has Member's Name and Unsuccessful Draw sent to antelope@oneshotpastshooters.com. This is the only way to record you on a list (List Two). The list is developed by when the email server places you in the inbox.
- 3) Past Shooters who did not apply for a tag through WY Game & Fish but request a license may send an email requesting a license to antelope@oneshotpastshooters.com. These members will be placed on List Three.
- 4) Past Shooters who are registered at the license draw but have made no advance request may request a tag in person. These Past Shooters will be placed at the bottom of List Three.
- 5) Past Shooters are entitled to a license while supplies last and may defer their license to a guest. If you wish to defer your license to a guest, the guest will assume the Past Shooters place on the list. If you wish to hunt yourself, you must receive a deferral from another Past Shooter on the list.
- 6) Past Shooters may add a guest to the guest list prior to the License Issuance. This list will be used if List One, Two and Three are exhausted.
- 7) Guests of Past Shooters may only receive <u>two</u> Past Shooter licenses per LIFETIME. The office will keep a list of guest licenses.
- 8) To receive a license from the One Shot Past Shooters Club, you and your guests must be registered for the Hunt Weekend.
- 9) Past Shooters on the list may change places on the list with another Past Shooter.
- 10) Guests **MAY NOT** transfer their license.
- 11) If a Past Shooter gives a license to a female guest, the guest must be at the license draw in person. The WY Game & Fish requires that they be there.
- 12) To receive a Past Shooter license, you <u>MUST BE PRESENT</u> and <u>YOUR GUEST MUST BE PRESENT</u>. If you are not present when your name is called your name will be placed at the bottom of the Past Shooter Priority List. If the Past Shooter is not present when called again, the Past Shooter forfeits his chance at a license.
- 13) A Past Shooter guest **MAY NOT** receive a license unless he/she is a registered guest for the Hunt Weekend and accompanied by the registered Past Shooter.
- 14) License issuance is usually held the Friday before the Hunt.
- 15) The Lists will be prepared and available at the Water for Wildlife Banquet.

2018 NEW SHOOTER INFO

- All new Past Shooters (last year's Team Members) will automatically go to the top of the list and receive a
 tag but must follow the procedures outlined in the Official Rules.
- You must apply for a License through Wyoming Game and Fish website. The website is wgfd.wyo.gov
- The Wyoming Game and Fish Website has dates/deadlines for applications. Please check carefully.
- Apply for a regular antelope license in areas 65, 66, 67, 68 or 106.
- Check the Wyoming Game and Fish website for the date they announce the draw. Notify the office of your status by email as outlined in the official rules on the day of the draw announcement.
- If you receive a license great, just let the office know. If you receive a denial, forward the denial to the office as outlined in the Official Rules on the day it is announced. You will still be at the top of the list with a denial but need to follow the guidelines outlined in the Official Rules.





Greetings Water For Wildlifers!

We rang in the New Year here in Lander, Wyoming at about -20 degrees with a fresh blanket of snow. With that in mind, it's a good time of year for planning and securing funding for summer habitat work to benefit wildlife across the West. We anticipate that wildlife managers will be submitting funding proposals in January in preparation for a summer of good work. The funding all of you helped raise to put conservation work on the ground will be dispersed to projects in the coming months. Thank you, as always for your tremendous support of wildlife and their habitat!

During the WFWF Board Meeting this past September, we heard Jacob Stoinski, one of the WFWF Interns, discuss his summer experience and all of the great work he did for Water for Wildlife and the Wyoming Game and Fish Department. Your Board believes, and I whole heartedly agree, these internship positions offer important opportunities for young wildlife professionals to learn more about the kind of jobs available to them, and where their talents might best fit. We've been so lucky to employ exceptional individuals each year of the program! A piece of exciting news on this front, it looks like we will be able to offer three internships in 2019. The usual two positions from June-September, and an additional position from October- December. All three positions will continue to split time equally between Water for Wildlife and Wyoming Game and Fish. In its fifth year, this program continues to grow, and helps both the Foundation and the Department tackle work that might otherwise not get done.

I will be working with Carl Asbell and everyone over at the WFWF office during the coming months to select the best projects to fund in the coming year. With several of us filling new roles within Water for Wildlife, it will be a team effort to make sure the best projects make the cut, and we stretch your funding as far as possible!


I hope this finds everyone in good health and good spirits for 2019! I'll be looking forward to meeting more of you and working with you this year.





Wild Game Recipe - CURRIED ANTELOPE MEATBALLS WITH CANDIED CARROTS







When you make these curried antelope meatballs, your kitchen is going to smell amazing. That is if you enjoy the fragrance of coriander, cumin, turmeric and garam masala. Serve the baked meatballs with these slow cooked candied carrots and a side of steamed brown or white rice.

As a side note... if you want to add another layer of indulgence, you could add coconut milk to the carrots while their cooking. You may need to increase the seasonings, since the coconut milk is a little overwhelming in flavor.

Substitute elk or venison

Serves 4

Meatball Ingredients

- 1 pound ground antelope meat
- 1 medium onion, grated (cheese grater)
- 1 garlic clove, finely chopped
- 1 teaspoon coriander
- 1 teaspoon cumin
- 1/2 teaspoon turmeric
- 1/2 teaspoon garam masala
- 1/2 teaspoon sea salt

Curry Candied Carrots

- 2 cups carrots, shaved into strips (potato peeler)
- 2 tablespoons unsalted butter
- 1 shallot, finely chopped
- 2 cloves garlic, finely chopped
- 1 tablespoon dark brown sugar
- 1/2 teaspoon garam masala
- 1/4 teaspoon sea salt

Directions

Preheat oven to 375° F.

Add all meatball ingredients to a bowl and mix everything together. Using your hands, shape 6 large meatballs and place on a non-stick baking sheet. Bake in oven for 30 minutes or until done.

While the meatballs are baking, heat a skillet over low heat and melt the butter. Add the chopped shallots and garlic. When the garlic is fragrant, add the shaved carrots to the skillet. Season the carrots with brown sugar, garam masala and sea salt. Slow cook the carrots until they become soft and golden brown around the edges. Remove from heat when done.

Serve the curried antelope meatballs and cooked carrots with a side of brown or white steamed rice.


